ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The college is named after the country's prominent freedom fighter, great administrator and the recipient of the Bharat Ratna-- Sh. Govind Ballabh Pant, and is duly affiliated to Himachal Pradesh University (Shimla). This college came into existence in July, 1959 but was formally inaugurated on 11th November, 1959 by Raja Bajrang Bahadur Singh of Bhadri estate, the then lieutenant Governor of Himachal Pradesh. Situated on the left bank of the river Satluj, the college is on the national highway no. 5 and at a distance of about 130 km from the historical town of Shimla, the capital city of Himachal Pradesh.

The college is a co-educational institution and imparts meaningful education in the faculties of Humanities, Science, Commerce, Vocation, and Computer Applications. After its inception in 1959 for undergraduate programmes, the year 1994 marked its new phase of academic development with the opening of Postgraduate classes in the subject of Hindi, English, Commerce, History, Economics, and Political Science. In the year 2017, the new PG courses in the subject of Sociology, Geography, Chemistry, Botany, Zoology, Physics and Mathematics were introduced. The self-finance course of Bachelor of Computer Applications (BCA) was started in the academic session 2010-11, based on the feedback of the stakeholders. The skill-oriented Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) was added to the programmes of the college in the year 2017. The primary objective for the implementation of these courses is to empower the youth with practical knowledge that will lead to quality employment and income generating opportunities.

The college campus has a green cover of trees, a sprawling playground and a well-equipped auditorium that provide a healthy ambience for the holistic growth of the students beyond their classrooms. It is surrounded by the scenic beauty of hills that provides the students with ample green space to learn and interact in a lively fresh environment. With modern laboratories and library, the learning experience of the students becomes extensive and practical. There are three girls' hostels and one boys' hostel which make the college an ideal centre for learning and knowledge. The physical infrastructural facilities in the college have expanded over the years to meet the new demands and also to provide better learning environment to the students. An Overview of the UGC-CBCS Undergraduate Programmes:

The CBCS provides an opportunity for the students to choose courses from the prescribed courses comprising Core, Compulsory, Skill Enhancement and Elective Courses. The courses are evaluated by following a grading system. In order to bring uniformity in the evaluation system and computation of the Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) based on student's performance in examinations, the UGC has formulated the guidelines to be followed.

Outline of Courses under Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

- 1. **Core Course**: A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as Core Course.
- 2. **Elective Course:** Generally, a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
 - 2.1 **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course:** Elective course offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
 - 2.2 **Dissertation/Project:** An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
 - 2.3 Generic Elective (GE) Course: An elective course which is other than discipline specific core course and is chosen generally from an <u>unrelated discipline/subject</u>, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic elective.
- 3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC): The Ability Enhancement Courses (AE) may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to knowledge enhancement: (i) Environmental Science and (ii) English/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC) are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
 - 3.1 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC): Environmental Science, English Communication/Modern Indian Language (MIL) Communication.
 - 3.2 **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.

Evaluation System of Undergraduate CBCS Programme

As per RUSA/HP University guidelines, the marks scheme for all undergraduate courses in annual system for BA/BCom will be in the ratio of 70:30, i.e.70 marks for theory (Annual/Term End Examination) and 30 marks for Continuous Comprehensive Assessment(CCA)/Internal Assessment (IA). In annual system for all courses of B.Sc. and B.Com practical subjects the ratio will be 50:20:30, i.e.50 marks for theory and 20 marks for practical (Annual/Term End) and 30 marks for CCA/IA.

As per University norms 30% marks of CCA will be determined by the concerned teacher in the annual system on the basis of following components:

- 1. House Test = 10
- 2. Term Test/Class Test=05
- 3. Assignments/Seminars=10
- 4. ClassroomAttendance=5

However, in BSc Physical Sciences, 30% marks of CCA will comprise of:

- 1. Assignment/Quiz/Seminar/model/Mid-Term=15 marks
- 2. Lab Seminar/ Lab CCA=10 marks
- 3. Attendance: 05 marks

In the annual system classroom attendance will be defined as follows:

Note:- Term Test will be conducted by teacher on completion of 40% syllabi. House Test on completion of 75% syllabi.

Mid Term/House Test

- One Mid Term/HouseTest of 10 marks (AnnualSystem) will be conducted in each academic year.
- It is mandatory for every student to appear in the MidTerm/House Test and the marks obtained shall contribute to the total IA/CCA of 30%.
- As per University guidelines the students who do not get 35% marks in IA/CCA will not be allowed to appear in Annual Examination.

Other Information Related to Evaluation

- 1. Internal Assessment/Continuous Comprehensive Assessment (CCA) and Term End Examinations will be as per RUSA provisions for annual system.
- 2. In annual system, the minimum passing marks is 40% in aggregate. However, it is mandatory to score 35% in CCA and also 35% in the Final Examination for passing.
- 3. A candidate failing either in one or two subjects/papers in annual examination will be placed under compartment in those subjects/papers. Such students will have only two chances one at supplementary stage and another at the annual stage to clear his/her compartment.
- 4. A candidate failing in three or more subjects/papers will be treated as fail in that year and will have to repeat the entire year.
- 5. The result shall be declared as per grading system and the students will have to complete the degree within5years.
- 6. Re-evaluation shall be applicable as per provisions of HP University ordinance for annual system.
- 7. Final examinations shall be held in the month of March/April and supplementary examinations in the month of September/October every year.
- Note: The above guidelines/conditions may vary as per latest notification by the University

Course Wise Allocation of Seats

Eligibility For Admission

- Bachelor of Arts (BA Pass Course): The students who have passed +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four written subjects (including English) with 33% marks. However, the students opting Mathematics as one of the subjects of study must have 45% marks in aggregate or 45% marks in Mathematics at +2 level.
- 2. Bachelor of Science (B.Sc. Pass Course): +2 examinations or an examination equivalent thereto of a Board/University established by law in India with pass in four subjects (three science subjects & one English) with 45% marks. The students seeking admission in B.Sc. 1st year (non-Medical) have the option to choose either Chemistry or Computer Science as one of the Discipline Specific Courses for study.
- 3. Bachelor of Commerce (B.Com. Pass Course): The candidates with 40% marks in commerce stream or 45% marks in four written subjects, including English at +2 level, are eligible for admission to B.Com. pass course. The minimum eligibility condition for a girl student to get admission in B.Com. is 33% marks in +2 examination. However, for admission to B.Com. pass course the candidate must have passed Mathematics/ Economics as compulsory subject at his/her+2 stage.
 - **Note:** i. All the admissions in BA/BSc/BCom 1stYear will be made on the basis of merit of the qualifying examination, that is, on the basis of percentage/marks of +2 examination.
 - ii. The student placed under compartment or failed in +2 examinations are not eligible for seeking admission.

Age Limit and Relaxation

- 1. Admission is not granted to the student in 1stYear if he/she has attained the age of 23 in the case of boys and 25 in the case of girls on 1stJuly of the year concerned.
- 2. The upper age limit will be raised by three years for students belonging to SC/ST categories.
- 3. The Principal has discretion to provisionally grant age relaxation to the students of general category up to a maximum of six months subject to the final approval by the Vice-Chancellor of H.P. University.

Required Documents/Certificates (to be uploaded while applying online)

- 1. Original Matriculation Certificate for the proof of date of birth
- 2. Original 10+2 certificate
- 3. Applicants coming from Board/University other than the HP Board of School Education/HP University must upload Original Migration Certificate
- 4. Original Character Certificate issued from the office of the Head/ Principal of Institution / School last attended or by a gazetted officer in the case of private candidates. The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application
- 5. In the case of gap year, a completely filled self-declaration form (the format is available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus)
- 6. In the case of gap year, Original character certificate issued by the SDM of the area concerned (Character certificate issued other than the above will not be accepted. The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application.)
- 7. Himachal Bonafide Certificate (for tuition fee concession in case of girls)
- 8. Original SC/ST/OBC Certificate issued by competent authority (SC/ST/OBC candidates only)
- 9. Original EWS Certificate, IRDP Certificate, Ex-servicemen Certificate, WFF Certificate and PH Certificate issued by competent authority (for candidates applying under these categories)
- 10. For single girl child reservation, the single girl child will have to submit certificate from the competent authority, i.e., Secretary of Gram Panchayat. (Single girl child means a girl who is the only child of her parents and she has no other brother and sister).

Admission to BA/BSc/BCom 2nd& 3rd Year Along with Guidelines

- 1. Admission to BA/BSc/BCom2ndyear and3rdyearis on Roll on basis for which they have to apply through online mode only.
- 2. In the roll on system, the students who have studied in 1st and 2nd year in the previous session are allowed to take provisional admission in the next class, i.e. in 2nd and 3rd year respectively, without waiting for the final result of the previous year.
- 3. The students have to fill up the online admission form and deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period as per the schedule notified by H.P. University. Admission schedule as notified by H.P University will be displayed on the college website and the notice board of the college.
- 4. The printout/hard copy of the application form should also be submitted in as per the instructions from the college.

Instructions to Students Taking Roll On Admission:

- 1. The students admitted in BA/ BSc/ BCom 2nd year will study two more courses-- Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC 1 & SEC 2) -- in the subject/discipline of their first choice (DSC I) studied in 1st year. These two courses will be in additions to Core courses (DSCs & Compulsory English/Hindi/Sanskrit) studied in 1st year.
- 2. The students admitted in BA/BCom 3rd year will study two Discipline Specific Elective Courses (DSE I & DSE II) and two Generic Elective Courses (GEs) along with two SECs (SEC 3 & SEC 4). It should be noted that DSE I & DSE II will be of the same discipline as DSC I & DSC II of the previous class respectively. The two GEs will be from any one discipline/subject other than the two DSCs/DSEs.
- 3. The students of BSc 3rd year will study three DSEs (DSE I, DSE II & DSE III) and two SECs (SEC 3 & SEC 4).

Refusal And Cancellation of Admission: (In accordance with HPU Ordinance)

- 1. The Principal may grant or refuse admission to any student on the recommendation of the admission committee.
- 2. Admission will not be granted after the expiry of admission dates.
- 3. <u>Cancellation of Provisional Admission at the time of physical verification</u>: If any student fails to produce the original documents for verification, and submit the attested copies of required documents along with the Original Character certificate, Original Migration Certificate (if applicable) & Self Declaration for gap in education (format available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus), then his/her provisional admission can stand cancelled.

Introduction to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) Degree Programme:

The University Grants Commission (UGC) has launched a scheme on skill development based job oriented high education program as a part of College/University education, leading to Bachelor of Vocation (B.Voc.) degree. This degree Program is unique with the provision of multiple entry and exist at different levels of NSQF from level 5 to 7, viz. Diploma/Advance Diploma and Degree in compliance to the National Skills Qualification Framework (NSQF). Multiple entry and exist will allow students the flexibility to earn and study as per their convenience.

Objectives:

- To provide multiple entry and exit options at various levels through program design in conformation to the skill components.
- To create requisite job role specific skilled manpower for industry at various NSQF levels as per NOS's (National Occupational Standards).
- To empower the youth leading to employment and income generating opportunities.
- To provide judicious mix of skills relating to a profession and appropriate content of general education.
- To provide flexibility to the students by means of pre-defined entry and multiple exit levels.
- To integrate skill based NSQF complaint vocational studies with the undergraduate level of higher education in order to enhance employability of the graduates and meet the industry requirements. Such graduates apart from meeting the needs of local and national industry are also expected to be competent to become part of the global workforce.

Course Structure:

B.Voc. programme is designed with the provision for multiple exit levels. All the candidates enrolled for diploma courses or further will be treated at par from the second semester onwards. Students may exit after six months with the certificate (NSQF Level 4) or they may continue for diploma or advance diploma level courses leading to B.Voc. degree.

Following table provides a snapshot of the various certificates and their duration:-

Multiple Entry and Exit Options:

- After the completion of **Semester I**, the candidate will get a Certificate, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- The candidate may rejoin **Semester II**. After the completion of **Semester II**, the candidate will get a Diploma, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- The candidate may rejoin **Semester III**. After the completion of **Semester III and IV**, the candidate will get an Advanced Diploma, and she/he may go for a job or continue studying.
- The candidate may rejoin **Semester V**. After the completion of **Semesters V and VI**, the candidate will be awarded a B.Voc. Degree and she/he may go for a job or become an entrepreneur, or continue studying for the M.Voc. Degree (NSQF Level 8 onwards) and can register for Ph.D. Degree (NSQF Level 10) after Vocational studies, or they can take admission in any other masters' programme after completion of required Bridge course, or appear in any competitive examinations conducted by State Public Service Commission and Union Public Service Commission.

INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME:

- Internship for 6 weeks after the completion of each year is an integral/essential component of B. Voc. degree.
- The Internship shall also carry credits to be added in the final evaluation of skill components.
- HPKVN (Himachal Pradesh Kaushal Vikas Nigam) is fully sponsoring the internship apart from facilitating the skill component (60%) of this programme along with courseware for whole of the programme.
- Candidates enrolled for this programme are entitled for 'Kaushal Vikas Bhatta' as per state government policy.

JOB OPPORTUNITIES

RETAIL MANAGEMENT

- After the completion of the first semester, the student will get a "Sales Associate" Certificate in the Retail Management Sector from Retailers Association's Skill Council of India (RASCI). The candidate may work as a certified resource in any retail-related industry.
- After the completion of the **second semester**, the student will get a combined "Team Leader" Diploma in the Retail Management sector from Retailers Association's Skill Council of India (RASCI) and Himachal Pradesh University. The candidate may get an opportunity to work in any retail-related industry.
- After the completion of the second year, the student will get a combined "Departmental Manager" Advanced Diploma in the Retail Management sector from Retailers Association's Skill Council of India (RASCI) and Himachal Pradesh University. Admission to B.Voc. Programme

Instructions for Admission to B.Voc

Admission to the B. Voc. programme will be as per the rules and regulations of the Himachal Pradesh University. The candidates will have to download the college prospectus from the college website www.gbpmgcrampur.edu.in. The candidates are advised to read the various instructions regarding admission in the prospectus before applying for admission. The candidates seeking admission should **apply online w.e.f. 30th June, 2023 to 8th July, 2023**. The students appearing in the merit list will undergo online counselling by the admission committee and the recommended students will have to deposit the prescribed fee within the stipulated period as per the HPU /College schedule. Later on, every student will also have to approach the admission/scrutiny committee for physical verification as per the schedule notified by the college.

Important:1)Provisionally admitted students (who have deposited the Fee) should note that it is compulsory
for all of them (and their parents) to submit an online Anti-Ragging undertaking affidavit every
academic year by visiting the website:

Eligibility:

- The eligibility criteria for admission to the B. Voc. degree programme shall be 10+2 in all streams from are cognized board; 10+2examination or an examination equivalent thereof from a Board/University established by law in India with English as a compulsory subject with 45% marks in aggregate, OR any examination of a University/Board/College or School in a foreign country recognized as equivalent for the above purpose by the Vice-Chancellor/Equivalence Committee on its own, OR on the recommendation of Association of India Universities with 45% marks OR as per eligibility norms of the college for admission to undergraduate courses in case of center of excellence.
- Vocational subjects under NSQF will be given weightage, equivalent to any other general education subject while considering admission to students to the undergraduate courses as per reference no. DD No. 1-52/2013(CC/NSQF) dated 30-04-2014of UGC.

Age Limit: Maximum age limit for admission to B. Voc. courses is 23 years for general category, 25 years for SC/ST category and 25 years for girl candidates, as on July 1 of the admission year. The Vice-Chancellor may permit age relaxation as per norms.

Reservation rules: Reservation rules are applicable as per the rules or guidelines of the Himachal Pradesh Government. **Other Important Information:**

- 1. Students belonging to SC/ST category shall be given a 5% relaxation in marks for admission purpose i.e., they would require a minimum of 40% marks in aggregate at 10+2 level.
- 2. Compartment students shall not be allowed admission in the B.Voc.programmes.
- 3. A candidate cannot pursue two full time undergraduate courses simultaneously.
- 4. The University reserves the right to cancel any admission at any stage.
- 5. In matters relating to undergraduate admissions, the decision of the Admission Committee/Vice-Chancellor, Himachal Pradesh University, Shimla, shall be final.
- 6. All legal matters pertaining to undergraduate admissions shall be subject to the Himachal Pradesh Jurisdiction only.

Mode of Selection:

- Admission to the B.Voc. programme in Retail Management and Hospitality&Tourism(Semester-I) shall be done purely on the merit of the qualifying examination(10+2 etc.).
- There are three categories of candidates who shall be given admission in Semester-I of the skill-based courses under NSQF.
- Category 1:Students who have already acquired NSQF certification Level 4 in a particular Industry sector may opt
for admission in the skill-based courses under NSQF
- **Category 2:** Students who have acquired NSQF certification Level4, but may like to change their trade and enter into skill-based courses in a different trade.
- **Category 3:** Students who have passed the 10+2 examination with conventional schooling without any background of vocational training.

NOTE: Regarding selection of students for B.Voc. programme, 10% extra weight age shall be given to Category-1; 5% extra weight age shall be given to Category-2 in 10+2 examination. Final list of students shall be finalized on merit.

In Bhadri Girl's Hostel, the seats reserved for the SC/ST/OBC and Physically Handicapped girls are 15%, 7.5% and 5% respectively.
- The application forms alongwith the required documents/certificates, for admission to any of the above hostels should reach the concerned hostel warden/clerk on or before the last date of admissions notified by the college.
- All the senior hostel residents are informed that they should apply for the hostel accommodation well in time failing which the vacant seats will be given to the students seeking admission in the college hostel.

SOCIAL OUTREACH

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC):

NCC training instills a feeling of patriotism and discipline in the cadets for upholding the unity and integrity of our country and it prepares them for rendering services to our motherland in times of peace and natural calamities. The college unit offers two army wings with two caretaker officers (CTOs). The students may join NCC by filling in enrolment form available in the college office. The students enrolled under NCC are required to attend minimum 40 parades in a session as per the schedule. It is compulsory to attend theses parades in addition to 2 camps in order to appear for 'B' & 'C' certificate examinations. The cadets also learn mountaineering and rock climbing under different camps.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS):

The college has two units of NSS with hundred volunteers each. The units follow the motto "Not Me But You" and actively organize cleanliness drives, plantation drives and awareness programs in the college as well as in the adopted villages. The volunteers also participate in a seven day special camp every year. A NSS certificate is given to a volunteer who devotes 120 hours of social work in one year for a certain or cumulative period, i.e., 240 hours in two years and attend the special camp of seven days.

The college runs a unit of Rovers (Boys) and Rangers (Girls) programme under one Ranger Leader and one Rover Leader. The college unit comprises of 24 Rovers and 24 Rangers. The students enrolled as Rovers and Rangers in the college are given training for the service of the Nation and humanity at large. Various activities with an aim to encourage the spirit of national integration and oneness are organized by the unit. The activities include adventure sports, community development, organizational work, skill development & awareness programmes organized by Bharat Scouts & Guides New Delhi. The Rangers and the Rovers earn various badges through their training camps. Aiming at the development of young students in achieving their physical, intellectual, social and spiritual potential as individuals; the college runs Rovers & Rangers. There are 24 seats respectively for Rovers & Rangers in the college, for which application forms are invited in the beginning of academic session, after scrutinising the forms the selected students will be induced in R&R after completing codal formalities accordingly.

GOVERNACE AND ADMINISTRATION

Parent Teacher Association (PTA):

To encourage community participation in education, Parent Teacher Association (PTA) under sections 2.33 to 2.33.7 of the H.P. Education Code, 2001 has been established. Parent Teacher Association (PTA) has emerged as an effective solution to the problems of students and teachers in the field of education. It is a non-political body for better coordination and interaction between parents and teachers for improvement of academic standards and infra-structural facilities of the college, giving utmost priority to students' welfare. The nomination of CSCA office bearers and class representatives is held on the date notified by H.P.University.

ACADEMIC OUTREACH

IGNOU Study Centre- 1110:

Indira Gandhi National Open University, New Delhi, opened a study centre in this college in1996. CONDUCT AND DISCIPLINE

Leave Rules:

- 1. A student can proceed on leave with the prior permission from the college Principal. The application should also be prior signed by parent/guardian of the student and duly recommended by the teacher.
- 2. A teacher can sanction leave up to maximum of 5 days and leave for longer duration will be sanctioned by the college Principal.
- 3. The student should make sure that the leave is noted by all the concerned teachers.
- 4. Leave on account of illness, if more than three days, must be accompanied by the medical certificate.
- 5. Students participating in various inter-college or inter-university or other competitions including NCC camps will have to get their leave sanctioned by the college Principal on the recommendation of their in charges before their departure.
- Note: The general leave will only be counted for the relaxation in fine only and not be counted as the lecture attended. In case of participation in sports, cultural, NCC, NSS and other activities, the credit will be given to the students and will be counted as lecture attended.

Other Rules and Regulations


- 1. A student without an identity card, duly signed by the Principal, is deemed an outsider.
- 2. Without identity card no student is allowed to enter the college.
- 3. It is mandatory for every student to maintain strict discipline within the college premises. Any act of a student that amounts to indiscipline will be dealt strictly. The following act comes within the ambit of indiscipline and misconduct: -
 - Ragging in and around the college campus
 - Eve-teasing

- Scribbling/ Writing anything on the black-board, furniture, walls etc.
- Damaging college property-Breaking furniture/window panes/Tempering electrical and water fittings
- Removing notices
- Holding any meeting/ function/ party & taking photographs in the college premises without prior permission of the Principal
- Using foul language with any student/Principal/teacher or any other employee of the college
- Bringing outsiders to the campus
- Smoking/ chewing tobacco/ taking drugs/ intoxicants/ alcohol anywhere in the college premises
- Spitting
- Any other act or acts which the Principal considers as major acts of misconduct and indiscipline

Strict action will be taken against defaulters.

- 4. All the students are directed to read the notices thoroughly which are displayed exclusively on the college notice board every day and do the needful accordingly.
- 5. Use of mobile phones in the class rooms or anywhere in the college campus is strictly prohibited in order to maintain academic environment. Any student found using mobile phones in the classroom/ examination hall will be viewed seriously.
- 6. The name of a student shall be struck off from the college rolls, if there is an absence without sanctioned leave continuously for 10 days or more.
- 7. Regarding Readmission: If the name of a student is struck off, he/ she must be accompanied by his/ her parent or guardian at the time of admission. Re-admission will only be granted after the recommendation of the teacher concerned and the final approval by the Principal.

The student must seek re-admission within six days.

General Instructions:-

Fee structure and Mode of Payment

The fees of all type prescribed for the Applicant(s) are mentioned in prospectus.

However, the Applicants are required to follow the procedure mentioned below for payment of the fees:-

- After submitting application, <u>'Pay prospectus fee'</u> link will be visible in the second grid of dashboard page. Applicant(s) will be able to see applications submitted by them in the application status grid with fees payment (prospectus fees) status.
- <u>'Pay prospectus fee'</u> link will be available there only for those applications for which the prospectus fees is not already paid.
- Fee can only be deposited from various online mode.
- Online Payment Applicant(s) can pay using Net banking, Debit Card, UPI (Google Pay, Phone Pe, Paytm, Bhim, etc.) for Online Payment to the college.
- <u>Pay now</u> link will be disabled after the last date of submission of form.

- 5 In the case of gap year, a completely filled self-declaration form (the format is available as Annexure 1 at the end of the prospectus and can also be downloaded from the college website." In the case of gap year, Original character certificate issued by the SDM of the area concerned (Character certificate issued other than the above will not be accepted.) The character certificate should have been issued within the last six months on the day of application
- 6 Himachal Bonafide Certificate (for tuition fee concession in case of girls)
- 7 Original SC/ST/OBC Certificate issued by competent authority (SC/ST/OBC candidates only)
- 8 Original EWS Certificate, IRDP Certificate, Ex-servicemen Certificate, WFF Certificate and PH Certificate issued by competent authority (for candidates applying under these categories)
